Scope of Works

these Grade II listed mews in Kensington. The part cobbled, gated cul-desac, approached through it's own arch on Canning Place in the Royal borough, contains 17 properties now used for residential purposes, but were originally a working stables / coach house. Initially constructed in the 19th Century, the Mews and it's surrounding buildings withstood the impact of high explosive bomb in 1941 which fell close by.

Restore London's work was planned & executed in full compliance with the "De Vere" Conservation Area controls. The project consisted of preparation & re-decoration of the brickwork facades, the ornate woodwork & metalwork within & the mansard roofs repaired. Restoration works, which included rebuilding of parapets also extended to Canning Place Mews, De Vere Gardens & Kensington Palace Elevations.
