Originally constructed in 1866 after Florence Nightingale's zealous campaign for health reforms, The Royal Herbert Hospital, set in over 19 acres of land, was constructed for the Woolwich Garrison as a monument to her. Named after Sidney Herbert, the War Secretary of the day, the decorous frontage in Italianate architectural style is now home to luxury apartments.
